Forest cover wise largest FSC project in the world.

What is FSC certification?

- UN Conference on Sustainable Development in 1992 (Rio Summit), concerned business representatives, social groups and environmental organizations got together and established the Forest Stewardship Council.
- Its purpose is to improve forest management worldwide.
- The Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) is a nongovernmental,
 - Non-profit organization that promotes management of the world's forest
- The responsible management of the world's forests.
 - Established in 1993 as a response to concerns over global deforestation
- FSC logo is the guarantee that it has come from responsibly managed & sustainable forests that maintain the highest environmental & social standards.
- 50% of paper industry in U.K. is FSC certified and other international companies are using FSC certified wood / pulp and recycled content to manufacture paper and paper products
- Presently most of countries are allowing only FSC certified products
- Almost all European countries are signatories
- Need of the hour is to keep pace with the worldwide progress and go for FSC certification.

Why Bhamragarh Forest Division?

- Largest Forest Division in India having 3677.32 Sq kms of Forest cover, with Largest (88%) Bamboo area.
- On the instructions of MOEF, NMBA identified Bhamragarh Forest Division and started the certification process
- First Government (Forest Dept) FSC project in India and Third project in India (Previous 2 being small private plantations raised by paper mills Total area: 11571 Ha)
- Forest cover wise largest FSC project in the world

How Bhamaragarh Forest Division is getting benefited?

- Timber Firewood Bamboo & other MFP including Honey from Bhamragarh Forest Division will be FSC certified
- Products from forest produce such as paper, articles made from bamboo etc. will also be FSC certified
- European countries being signatory to FSC, accept only FSC certified product
- Lot of demand for FSC certified produce from Bhamragarh Forest Division by exporters
- Increase socio-economical status of the people residing in the area
- Maintaining FSC standard will enhance efficiency and raise the standard
